

Restricted Access Area

Entry Prohibited

Seabird and shorebird conservation

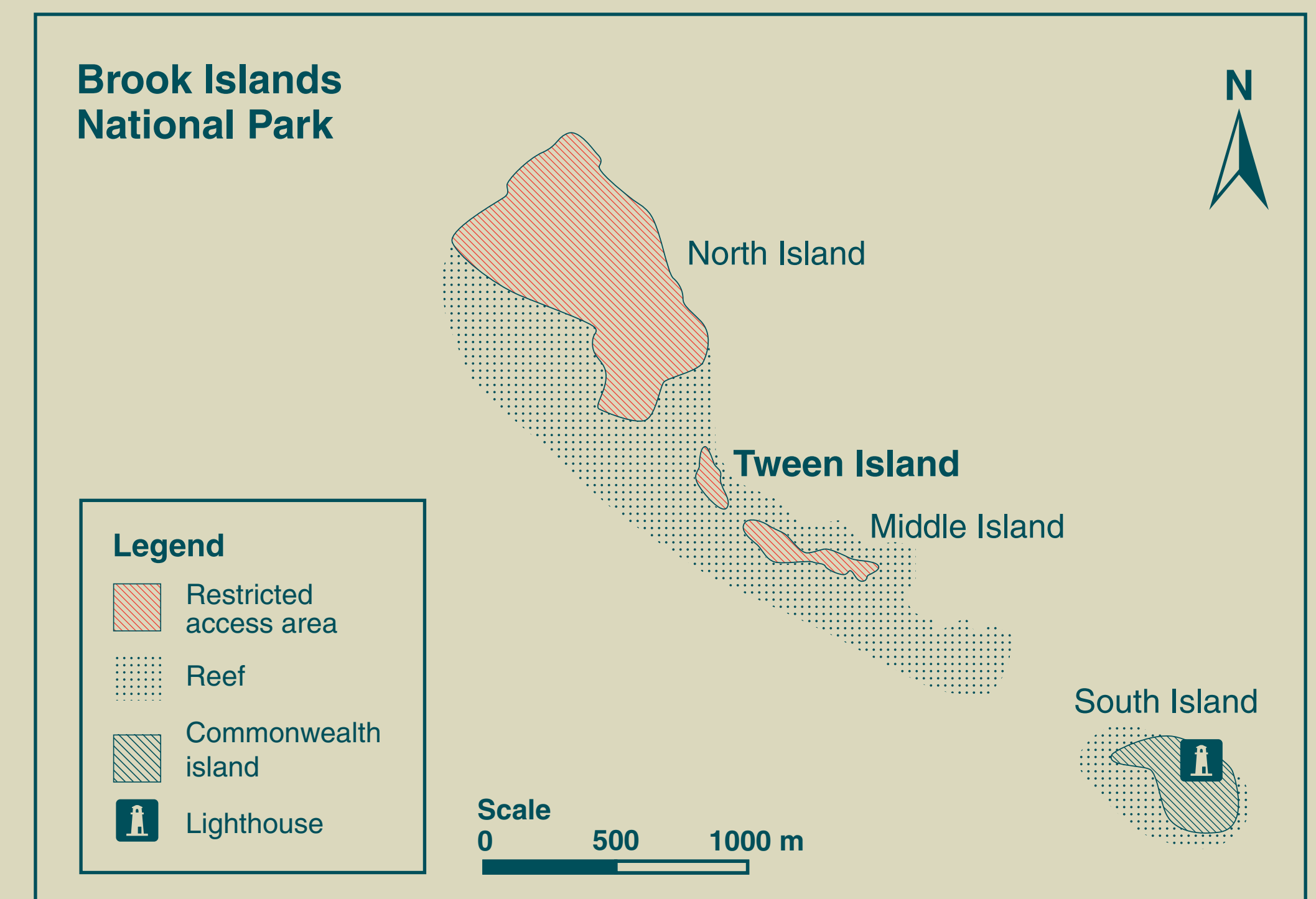
Entry to this island—Tween Island, Brook Islands National Park (refer to map)—is prohibited without a permit or written approval.

The closure protects nesting and roosting seabirds and shorebirds—which are easily distressed—and their habitats. Nesting birds will leave their nests if disturbed—eggs and chicks are then vulnerable to heat, cold and predators, and can die quickly.

Contravention of a requirement of this notice is an offence under the *Nature Conservation Act 1992*.

Maximum penalty: 80 penalty units.

On-the-spot fines apply.
