

Marine Parks Regulation 2006

Marine Parks Act 2004

Special activity notice—Moreton Bay Marine Park

In accordance with section 103 of the *Marine Parks Regulation 2006*, a special activity has been declared for the area known as the South Stradbroke Artificial Reef, which is located in Moreton Bay Marine Park and bounded by the following coordinates referenced to the GDA 94 datum:

- 27° 52.350' S, 153° 27.081' E
- 27° 53.439' S, 153° 26.987' E
- 27° 53.439' S, 153° 27.614' E
- 27° 52.350' S, 153° 27.707' E

The purpose of this declaration is to manage use of the artificial reef to exclude incompatible uses and to minimise health and safety risks.

Activities that are considered to be special activities for this area are:

- a. scuba diving
- b. surface-supplied-air diving
- c. commercial fishing

Under section 131 of the *Marine Parks Regulation 2006*, a person may conduct a special activity in the area only under:

- I. a permission that specifically authorises the conducting of the activity; or
- II. a commercial activity agreement that specifically authorises the conducting of the activity.
