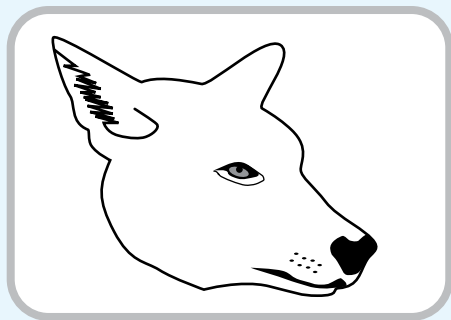

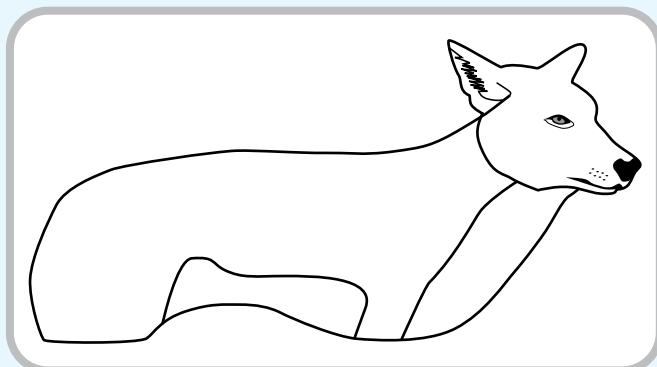
1 Draw the outline shape of the head and ears.
